EXHIBITORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO ADHERE TO THE PEN REQUIREMENTS OUTLINED IN PARAGRAPH 7 BELOW

ALL MARKET HOGS MUST SUBMIT DNA SAMPLES WITHIN THE REQUIRED TIME LIMITS

COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS (subject to change without notice):

This show is co-sponsored by the National Junior Swine Association and the Team Purebred Junior Association.

1. All entrants must have read and be familiar with the Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements, Junior Livestock Competition Requirements, Junior Livestock Sale Participation Requirements, IAFE National Show Ring Code of Ethics and Health Requirements. Exhibitors must comply with the Wholesome Meat provisions. Exhibitors are encouraged to read and be fully aware of the contents of the Drug Residue Avoidance Guidelines.
2. All exhibitors in Open, Junior Breeding and Market shows must submit a Premises ID (PID) number at the time of entry. PID may be obtained online on the Colorado Department of Agriculture website.
3. **BEDDING:** Exhibitors are responsible for their own livestock bedding. Entry into competition at the Colorado State Fair and Industrial Exposition does not include bedding. Bedding may be pre-purchased at the time of entry. Pre-purchased bedding may be picked up in the designated area on load-in days. Exhibitors must be present to claim their pre-purchased bedding. Refunds will not be issued for any pre-purchased bedding.

Straw may only be used for Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Breeding Sheep and Breeding Cattle tie-outs. All other uses of straw are prohibited.

Outside bedding for livestock exhibitors is permitted.

4. **BARN SECURITY/RESTRICTED AREA:** For security reasons, all Market Hog, Market Lambs, Market Goat and Market Beef barns will be locked at **9:00 p.m.** every night prior to sale date, and remain locked until 6:00 a.m. the following morning. Each barn will have Colorado State Fair Public Safety Officers to secure the area and to enforce the nightly lock down. Exhibitors must confine their animals within their designated stall or pen assignment.
5. Jr. Market Barrows and Gilts are eligible to show and must weigh no less than **235** pounds and no more than **290** pounds to be eligible to show.
6. Pseudorabies test requirements:
 - a. A pig must originate from Colorado or a Pseudorabies Free Status State when purchased for feeding and the exhibitor must provide evidence (bill of sale) of the pig's origin prior to unloading at the State Fair.
 - b. Arrive at the fair with a current health certificate.
 - c. If conditions A and B above are met, a Pseudorabies test is not required.
 - d. If condition A above is not met, the pigs must be tested and negative for Pseudorabies prior to entry into the State Fair.
7. All purebred hogs must have registration papers which have been transferred to or registered in the name of the junior exhibitor and not in a family or farm name by July 1, 2021. All entries must be owned and have primary care by the exhibitor as of June 1, 2021. Home raised pigs require a statement of such signed by a parent or guardian.
8. Each individual exhibitor will be permitted to bring no more than four (4) hogs in the Jr. Market Hog Show. **If an exhibitor brings 1 or 2 pigs, they are allowed only one pen; 3 to 4 pigs are allowed two pens. Members of a family will be required to group two hogs together. If dividers are required within a pen, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to provide their own adjustable panel. NO TACK PENS WILL BE AVAILABLE.** Standard pen size is approximately 6'x6'. Any items such as feed, show boxes, etc. placed in pens not assigned to an exhibitor will be removed without warning. Check with the Superintendent for availability of space for tack placement. If stalling capacities are reached, entries will be returned to the exhibitor. Exhibitors may bring their own plywood (16"x3') to place over their designated pens only. Colorado State Fair does not provide plywood.
9. A water container, with water, must be visible and available for watering on a regular basis in each pen/stall area at all times. Colorado State Fair Officials reserve the right, at its discretion, to contact a CSF veterinarian to determine if water should be given. Absolutely no feeding or watering of animals in show rings, holding pens or to and from re-weigh stations.
10. All Market Hogs must have a minimum of one-half inch (1/2") hair from the neck to the back excluding the tail and belly. Clipping of hogs with cordless clippers will be permitted prior to inspection. No hoof treatments are allowed in the Jr. Market Hog division.
11. Market Hogs cannot use any compounds including hairdressing compounds, oils, paints, powders, glitter or other dressings at any time. Water based conditioning products only. ;Only oil allowed on feet. Hogs must have been washed with soap and water only and clean for inspection.
12. **ENTRY NUMBERS:** Each entry will be assigned a number. Entry numbers will be provided to all exhibitors. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor when the animal is in the show ring.

13. There will be no official weigh-in of Market Hogs. Scales will be available for the exhibitors' use until the deadline for turning in the weight nomination form. An official weight nomination form must be obtained by the Exhibitor when the animal is inspected. The official weight nomination form must be turned into the Livestock Office no later than the deadline listed above. The weight(s) indicated on the weight nomination form will be the official show weight. There will be no changing of weights after the weight nomination form has been turned in.
14. Classes should be entered by breed classification only. Market classes will be offered in the breed divisions listed; with the order of show from lightweight to heavyweight divisions.
15. All Market Hog entries must include ear notch numbers, and the notches should be uniform, healed and match registration papers per National Swine Registry rules. Any questionable notches will not be allowed to show. All hogs entered in breed classes will be checked at processing by NJSA/NSR and Team Purebred personnel. DNA will not be considered for eligibility when ear notches do not match entry cards. DNA hair samples are required for all hog entries.
16. Jr. Market Hogs will be reviewed by breed classification officials on Wednesday, August 25th at the time of inspection. If the breed classification officials determine that an entry in any breed division does not exhibit the characteristics required by that breed association, the entry will be transferred to a crossbred class. If the exhibitor does not accept the transfer, he/she can withdraw his/her entry from the show, but the entry fee for that animal will not be refunded.
17. There must be 15 or more in a breed division to establish individual breed classes. With less than 15 in a breed division, breeds will be combined and shown in the other purebred divisions (Dark OPB or White OPB). If there are not enough animals to make the Dark OPB or White OPB classes, those hogs will be shown in a general OPB class.
18. Special purebred classes will be provided for Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, Landrace, Spots, Poland China, Berkshire and Chester White hogs. Purebred classes will be broken by weight with approximately 15-20 animals per class, depending on the number of entries. All NJSA market hog entries must be registered Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire or Landrace. All Team Purebred market hog entries must be registered Berkshire, Chester White, Poland China or Spotted market animals.
19. All NJSA market Hogs are to be guaranteed negative of the stress gene to be exhibited at a NJSA or NSR event. At a Team Purebred event, all Chester White hogs are guaranteed to be stress negative. Berkshire hogs must be stress negative and stress status must be on the pedigree. NSR and NJSA reserve the right to randomly collect a DNA profile on exhibited animals for stress gene, parentage identification and breed purity at any event where registered animals are exhibited. This collection will be supervised by NSR or NJSA representatives.
20. All NJSA breed Champions, Reserve Champions and/or randomly selected market hogs may be blood tested for presence of the stress gene, parentage verification and breed purity.
21. NJSA and Team Purebred Champion and Reserve Champion overall premiums as well as breed Champion and Reserve Champion premiums will not be awarded until the DNA results are verified at the NSR office.
22. Any NJSA and Team Purebred hogs that fail these DNA tests for the stress gene, parentage verification or breed purity will be asked to forfeit all show premiums and awards. If premiums and awards are not returned to NSR, the exhibitor will not be allowed to compete in future NSR, NJSA or Team Purebred events.
23. Failed NJSA test results will not be publicized except in the normal listing of cancelled pedigrees that is published in the NSR newsletter, For the Record, and the NJSA newsletter. The Pinnacle Photos will also be removed from the NSR website, www.nationalswine.com.

24. Market hogs must meet all registration eligibility requirements of their respective breed associations. NSR and Team Purebred representatives will inspect all purebred hogs for eligibility.
25. Jr. Market Hogs will be divided into as near equal classes as feasible by breed and weight.
26. Hogs must be shown in natural conformation and color, except where stated otherwise in this premium list. Any product used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, false hair, artificial color, adhesives or other similar substances.
27. Exhibitors only are allowed in the hog holding or staging pens at any time.
28. After each class of Market Hogs has been placed, the top five animals will be weighed on the official scale by show officials. Market Hogs cannot deviate more than 5% above or below the declared show weight as previously designated by the exhibitor on the weight card. If any Market Hog is weighed out, it will be disqualified and the remaining animals will be moved up in placing. The disqualified hog is not eligible for any other class and will not be reweighed.
29. Once the sale hogs have been determined, those animals will be moved to a showcase area designed by the Livestock Superintendents. All equipment, except for those items needed to feed and water animals and clean stalls, shall be removed from the barn. The Colorado State Fair will provide each sale qualifying exhibitor with two (2) bags of shavings for use in the new stalling area.
30. This show is terminal only for the Jr. Market Hogs that are selected to the Junior Livestock Sale. Animals not selected for the Junior Sale will be released to the exhibitor after the final sale order is posted. The Colorado State Fair will offer a buyback consignment only if an adequate packer bid can be secured. In the event the Colorado State Fair is unable to obtain an adequate packer bid, all animals will remain in the possession of the exhibitor and must be removed from the grounds by 9:00 P.M. on Thursday, August 26th. Market Hog exhibitors are encouraged to utilize sound biosecurity practices upon departure from the Colorado State Fair; recommended biosecurity procedures are available in the Livestock Office.

2. Classes are limited to exhibitors with Jr. Market Hog Show entries. Exhibitors must show their own animal. Any animal marked as light or heavy cannot be used for Showmanship competition.
3. Three age divisions are offered with exhibitor’s age calculated as of December of the past year.
4. The Judge will consider appearance of the animal, showmanship ability of the exhibitor and the exhibitor’s appearance, courtesy and appearance.

THE NATIONAL SWINE REGISTRY, 2639 Yeager Road, West Lafayette, IN 47906, is a consolidation of the American Yorkshire club, American Landrace Association, Hampshire Swine Registry, and United Duroc Swine Registry and offers \$100.00 to the owner of the Grand Champion Barrow overall breeds in the on-foot show provided the barrow is registered Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire and is from a recorded litter. The owner must provide proof of registration and a picture to receive their award.

THE NATIONAL SWINE REGISTRY, 2639 Yeager Road, West Lafayette, IN 47906, offers \$100.00 to the owner of the Grand Champion carcass overall breeds provided the carcass is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire. The owner must show proof of a matching ear notch with a registration paper to receive the award. All award winners must submit proof of registry and supply an appropriate picture to the National Swine Registry within 60 days of the show to receive the award.

SWINE SHOW CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS

NOTE: All breeds must have been ear notched within seven days of birth. Any hog not properly ear-notched or having an ear notch that is not healed completely will be ineligible to show. All 4-H and FFA exhibitors must have completed the Youth Pork Quality-PLUS Certification.

BERKSHIRE:

- A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire characteristics.
- A Berkshire must have the white on all four legs, face and tail (unless tail is docked). One of the leg points may also be missing.
- A Berkshire must NOTE have a solid black nose (rim of nose).
- A Berkshire must NOT have a solid white or a solid black face from the ears forward.
- White is allowed on the ears, but NO solid white may appear on the ears.
- Occasional splash of white may appear on the body.

CHESTER WHITE:

- Must possess Chester White breed characteristics.
- Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
- Ears must be down and medium size.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DUROC:

- Must be red in color and possess Duroc breed characteristics (ears must be down and medium size).
- Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
- Must NOT have any black hair.
- Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
- Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.
- Must NOT have any evidence of an extra dewclaw.
- Must be stress negative,

HAMPSHIRE:

- Must be black in color with a white belt starting on a front leg. Belt may partially or totally encircle body. Animal is eligible if it has a black head and the body is totally white.
- Must possess Hampshire breed characteristics (ears must be erect and not rounded),
- Must NOT have any white hair or indication of streaking on the forehead.
- Must NOT have any red hair.
- Must be stress negative,

LANDRACE:

- Must be white in color and possess Landrace breed characteristics (ears must be down).
- Must NOT have any color hair other than white.
- Must NOT have more than three spots of skin pigmentation, exceeding the size of one United States minted quarter currency.
- Must be stress negative.

POLAND CHINA:

- Must possess Poland China breed characteristics.
- Must be black with six white points (face, feet and tail) with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog may not possess more than one black leg and be deterred a Poland China. (Tail docking is permissible eliminating that white point).
- Must have ears down.
- Must NOT have evidence of belt formation,
- Can NOT have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment
- Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering with possible ear tags are ineligible.

SPOTTED SWINE:

- Must be black and white in color.
- Must possess Spotted breed characteristics.
- Ears must be down and reasonably sized.
- Any red tinted or sandy brown spots are eligible.
- NO solid black head from ears forward.
- NO distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.

YORKSHIRE:

- Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire breed characteristics (ears must be erect).
- Must NOT have any colored hair other than white.
- Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than a U.S. minted silver dollar.
- Must NOT have markings above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.
- Must be stress negative.
