## COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS: (subject to change without notice)

1. All entrants must have read and be familiar with the Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements, Junior Livestock Sale Participation Requirements, IAFE National Show Ring Code of Ethics and Health Requirements. Exhibitors must comply with the Wholesome Meat provisions. Exhibitors are encouraged to read and be fully informed of the contents of the Drug Residue Avoidance Guidelines.
2. All exhibitors in Open, Junior Breeding and Market shows must submit a Premises ID (PID) number at the time of entry. PID may be obtained online on the Colorado Department of Agriculture website.
3. **BEDDING:** Exhibitors are responsible for their own livestock bedding. Entry into competition at the Colorado State Fair and Industrial Exposition does not include bedding. Bedding may be pre-purchased on Livestock Entry forms and must be received in the Livestock Office with payment by entry deadline. Pre-purchased bedding may be picked up in the designated area on load-in days. Exhibitors must be present to claim their pre-purchased bedding. Refunds will not be issued for any pre-purchased bedding.

Straw may only be used for Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Breeding Sheep and Cattle tie-outs. All other uses of straw are prohibited.

**Outside bedding for livestock exhibitors is permitted.**

4. **BARN SECURITY/RESTRICTED AREA:** For security reasons, all Market Hog, Market Lambs, Market Goat and Market Beef barns will be locked at **9:00 p.m.** every night prior to sale date, and remain locked until 6:00 a.m. the following morning. Each barn will have Colorado State Fair Public Safety Officers to secure the area and to enforce the nightly lock down. Exhibitors must confine their animals within their designated stall or pen assignment.
5. Female (does) or wethers are eligible to be shown in the Market Goat Show. All Market Goats are required to have the proper scrapie identification. There is a minimum weight limit of **55 lbs.** and a maximum weight limit of **110 lbs.** for goats.
6. Market Goats can use only rubber mats, netting or shavings for bedding; no straw, kitty litter or other absorbent.

7. Due to limited space NO tack pens will be available. All items such as feed, show boxes, trimming stands, etc. are to be placed in areas designated by the Superintendents. Any of these items placed in pens may be removed without warning. DO NOT take pens apart, leave as assembled. Exhibitors may bring plywood for the top of their pens for storage.
8. Market Goats must be carrying all milk teeth in normal positions. Goats showing either or both of the first pair of permanent incisors will be disqualified. The CSF retains the right to check teeth on Market Goats. Any such mouthing of animals will be conducted upon exiting the show ring and at the same time as the animals are being retinal scanned.
9. Clear adhesive only may be used on goat legs for show only, no adhesive may be used on goats entering the sale ring. Any adhesive used goats should be removed immediately after show. There will be no powdering, painting or coloring agent used on any market goat. No foreign matter, added hair or artificial hair will be allowed on any entry. Exhibitors in violation will not be allowed to show.
10. All goats will be required to have horns tipped blunt, no sharp points allowed.
11. Goats must be slick shorn and of uniform length from the knee and hock up prior to inspection. "Blocking" or fitting in an attempt to alter or enhance a goats appearance is not allowed. There will be no shearing allowed on show grounds. Only hand shearers and cordless clippers may be used for touch ups.
12. Market Goats may be shown with collars or halters (training/prong collars will be allowed). Fair Management and Superintendents reserve the right to approve "extreme" collars. Market Goat exhibitors may use meshed or plastic muzzles at the Colorado State Fair. The muzzle style must allow the goat to drink water.
13. ENTRY NUMBERS: Each entry will be assigned a number. Entry numbers will be provided to all exhibitors. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor when the animal is in the show ring.
14. A water container, with water, must be visible and available for watering on a regular basis in each penned/stalled area at all times. NO feeding or watering of livestock in show rings, holding pens or to and from re-weigh stations will be permitted. Colorado State Fair Officials reserve the right, at its discretion to contact a CSF veterinarian to determine if water should be given. **Drenching for hydration purposes will be allowed for Market Goats at the Colorado State Fair. No stomach pumping devises will be allowed.** Injection, drenching or application of any substance (including any caustic substance) per rectum is prohibited. Further, the application of any substance to or near the tail or anus is prohibited.
15. Exhibitors only are allowed in the goat holding or staging areas during show hours. No wet or iced towels will be allowed in the holding pens during the goat show.
16. There will be no official weigh-in of Market Goats. Scales will be available for the exhibitors' use until the deadline for turning in the weight nomination form. An official weight nomination form must be obtained by the Exhibitor when the animal is inspected. The official weight nomination form must be turned into the Livestock Office no later than the deadline listed above. The weight(s) indicated on the weight nomination form will be the official show weight. There will be no changing of weights after the weight nomination form has been turned in.
17. Classes will be separated by weight. In all Market Goat classes, the front feet of the goat must remain on the show ring floor while being shown. Judges and Superintendents will have discretion to enforce disqualification.
18. After each class of Market Goats has been placed, the top five animals will be weighed on the official scale by show officials. Market Goats cannot deviate more than 5% above or below the declared show weight as previously designated by the exhibitor on the weight card. If any Market Goat is weighed out, it will be disqualified and the remaining animals will be moved up in placing. The disqualified lamb is not eligible for any other class and will not be reweighed.

19. Champion and Reserve Champion of each weight division will compete for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion. The Champion and Reserve Champion in each weight division (lightweight, medium weight, and heavy weight) and the remaining 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place goats (not to exceed a total of 38 goats) will sell in the Colorado State Fair Junior Livestock Sale. Those exhibitors that have two or more sale qualified animals will only be eligible to sell (1) one animal.
20. Once the sale goats have been determined, those animals will be moved to a showcase area designated by the Livestock Superintendents. All equipment, except for those items needed to feed and water animals and clean stalls, shall be removed from the barn. The Colorado State Fair will provide each exhibitor with two (2) bags of shavings for use in the new stalling area.
21. This show is a terminal show only for the Jr. Market Goats selected for the Junior Livestock Sale. Animals not selected for the Junior Sale will be released to the exhibitor after the final sale order is posted. A buyback consignment is offered through the Colorado State Fair. Market Goat exhibitors are encouraged to utilize sound biosecurity practices upon departure from the Colorado State Fair; recommended biosecurity procedures are available in the Livestock Office.
