Competition Requirements:

- 1. All entrants must have read and be familiar with the Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements, Colorado State Fair Exhibitor Code of Conduct, Animal Welfare Policy, and Health Requirements. When applicable, all Association rules shall apply. Colorado State Fair Authority Management ("Management") will also enforce all PDCA Competition Requirements and Show Ring Code of Ethics.
- 2. All entrants for livestock exhibited in Open, Breed or Market competitions must provide a premises identification number (PID) at the time of entry. To obtain a PID, contact the Colorado Department of Agriculture at 303-869-9130 or www.coloradodepartmentofagriculture/animals ag.colorado.gov.
- 3. BEDDING: Exhibitors are responsible for their own livestock bedding. Entry into competition at the Colorado State Fair and Industrial Exposition ("CSF") does not include bedding. Bedding may be pre-purchased at the time of entry. Pre-purchased bedding may be picked up in the designated area on load-in days. Exhibitors must be present to claim their pre-purchased bedding. Refunds will not be issued for any pre-purchased bedding.

Straw may only be used for Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Breeding Sheep and Open Breeding Cattle tie-outs. All other uses of straw are prohibited.

Outside bedding for livestock exhibitors is permitted.

- 4. Colorado residency is not required. Exhibitors must be enrolled and active in 4-H (being 8 years of age and not have reached their 19th birthday as of December 31, 2023); in FFA and active in an approved VoAg school program and not have reached their 19th birthday as of December 31, 2023;, or a Jr. Breeding Association member with proof of membership, as a current year breeding project, and not have reached their 21st birthday as of December 31, 2023.
- 5. Females may be purebred or high grade. In case of grade heifers, exhibitors must submit proof of ownership (Colorado Brand Certificate/Permit) at check in. Registered animals must be registered or leased by an association under the name of the exhibitor with original papers in hand at check in. Association leases must be filed with the county by the May deadline.
- 6. Original proof of ownership on all animals must be available for inspection at the show.
- 7. Substitutions and add-ons must be made upon arrival and check-in. No exceptions. No exceptions will be accepted at the time of show.
- 8. To be eligible for competition, animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. Ownership papers and legal transfer forms must be in the exhibitor's name prior to showing. Transfers not formalized by the respective national breed association prior to show will be picked up by the superintendents and mailed to the appropriate breed association.
- 9. Owners/farms and families will be limited to 20 animals they may enter in individual classes. No more than two premiums will be awarded to any one owner in individual classes unless otherwise specified.
- 10. Animals owned in partnership may be shown in the name of the partnership only; except that at time of entry, a determination shall be made that such animals will be shown in the name of one (but not both) partners.
- 11. Exhibitor is considered the owner or member of the partnership owning the animal. Members of the same family or different families owning animals housed, as one herd on the same farm, will be considered as one exhibitor.
- 12. Breeder is considered the owner of the dam at the time of service.
- 13. Exhibitors should wear white shirts with white pants as appropriate show ring attire. No shorts will be allowed. No names or emblems will be allowed on animals or exhibitors.

- 14. ENTRY NUMBERS: Each entry will be assigned a number. Entry numbers will be provided to all exhibitors. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor when the animal is in the show ring.
- 15. In keeping with the basic philosophy of the PDCA, ethics are the individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. All exhibitors must maintain a reputation of integrity and present a wholesome and progressive image of Dairy Cattle in the proper care of and management of those animals at all times. All animals must be in a sound, healthy state and presented in the show ring in a respective manner. Violations of this code are subject to the disciplinary provisions of the appropriate dairy breed association and CSF Management.
- 16. Misrepresenting the age and/or milk status of any animal for the class in which it is shown, will be reported to the respective breed association and show management and will result in the animal and exhibitor being immediately disqualified.
- 1st through 6th place ribbons will be awarded in show classes. 17

- 1. The Superintendent will select a minimum of two qualifying animals from each breed during the selection of the breed Junior Champion and Senior Champion. Animals must have won first or second place in an individual class:
 - a. The female selected must be registered, identified or leased on a breed association program in the individual name of the youth owner or in a partnership with immediately family or one an approved breed association lease program in the exhibitor's name. Each junior must have an individual membership with the association.
 - b. The female selected must be bred by the individual owner or a partnership within an immediate family or have been purchased with ownership transferred to the individual's or partnership's name prior to the animal's first birthday.
- 2. The winner will be selected by the Judge plus one breeder of each of the breeds of dairy cattle being shown at the CSF. The Judge and breeders working individually will place an overall type score from 75 to 95 points on each female. The Superintendents will total the scores of the judge and the breeders and the female with the highest total score will be the award winner. If the females winning the Supreme Senior Champion and the Supreme

Junior Champion do not qualify for these awards, they will be given to the highest scoring females that meet all qualifications. If no females meet the qualifications or are not considered worthy of these awards, the awards will not be presented.

- 3. Cash awards will be paid directly from the Colorado Dairy Youth Foundation and presented at the Colorado State Fair.
 - \$1,000.00 to the first place Senior Female
 - \$ 400.00 to the second place Senior Female
 - \$ 500.00 to the first place Junior Female
 - \$ 200.00 to the second place Junior Female
