Competition Requirements:

1. All entrants must have read and be familiar with the Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements, Colorado State Fair Exhibitor Code of Conduct, Animal Welfare Policy, and Health Requirements. When applicable, all Association rules shall apply. Colorado State Fair Management will also enforce all PDCA Competition Requirements and Show Ring Code of Ethics.
2. All entrants for livestock exhibited in Open, Breed or Market competitions must provide a premises identification number (PID) at the time of entry. To obtain a PID, contact the Colorado Department of Agriculture at 303-869-9130 or online at www.coloradodepartmentofagriculture/animals.ag.colorado.gov.
3. **BEDDING:** Exhibitors are responsible for their own livestock bedding. Entry into competition at the Colorado State Fair and Industrial Exposition ("CSF") does not include bedding. Bedding may be pre-purchased at the time of entry. Pre-purchased bedding may be picked up in the designated area on load-in days. Exhibitors must be present to claim their pre-purchased bedding. Refunds will not be issued for any pre-purchased bedding.

Straw may only be used for Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Breeding Sheep and Open Breeding Cattle tie-outs. All other uses of straw are prohibited.

Outside bedding for livestock exhibitors is permitted.

4. Original registration papers on all registered animals must be available for inspection at the show.
5. Substitutions and add-ons must be made upon arrival and check-in. No exceptions. No substitutions will be accepted at the time of show.
6. To be eligible for competition, animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. Registration papers / ownership papers and legal transfer forms must be in the exhibitor's name prior to showing. Transfers not formalized by the respective national breed association prior to show will be picked up by the superintendents and mailed to the appropriate breed association.
7. Owners/farms and families will be limited to 20 animals they may enter in individual classes. No more than two premiums will be awarded to any one owner in individual classes unless otherwise specified.
8. Animals owned in partnership may be shown in the name of the partnership only; except that at time of entry, a determination shall be made that such animals will be shown in the name of one (but not both) partners.
9. Exhibitor is considered the owner or member of the partnership owning the animal. Members of the same family or different families owning animals housed, as one herd on the same farm, will be considered as one exhibitor.
10. Breeder is considered the owner of the dam at the time of service.
11. ENTRY NUMBERS: Each entry will be assigned a number. Entry numbers will be provided to all exhibitors. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor when the animal is in the show ring.
12. Exhibitors should wear white shirts with white pants as appropriate show ring attire. No shorts will be allowed. No names or emblems will be allowed on animals or exhibitors.
13. In keeping with the basic philosophy of the PDCA, ethics are the individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. All exhibitors must maintain a reputation of integrity and present a wholesome and progressive image of dairy cattle in the proper care of and management of those animals at all times. All animals must be in a sound, healthy state and presented in the show ring in a

respective manner. Violations of this code are subject to the disciplinary provisions of the appropriate dairy breed association and CSF Management.

14. Misrepresenting the age and/or milk status of any animal for the class in which it is shown, will be reported to the respective breed association and show management and will result in the animal and exhibitor being immediately disqualified.

15. Criticizing or interfering with the judges, Management, Superintendents or other exhibitors while on the fairgrounds, or any other conduct detrimental to the breed or show, will result in immediate dismissal from the grounds and disqualification.

16. 1st through 6th place ribbons will be awarded in show classes.

OPEN DAIRY SPECIAL AWARDS

DAIRY HERDSMAN AWARD: The Colorado State Fair Authority will present a special award and cash award of \$50.00 to the top Dairy Herdsman of the Open Show. The Superintendent and assistant Superintendents will consider the following to determine herdsman awards:

1. Number of animals exhibited.
2. Number of personnel working with the exhibit.
3. Neatness and cleanliness of stalls and surrounding alleys and other areas.
4. Cleanliness of animals throughout the show.
5. Promptness in presenting animals for judging.
6. Courtesy to Judges, Fair Officials, visitors and other exhibitors.
7. Educational message and demonstration material.
