# **Competition Requirements:**

Entry Fee \$20 per entry

- All entrants must have read and be familiar with the Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements, Colorado State Fair Exhibitor Code of Conduct, Animal Welfare Policy, and Health Requirements. When applicable all association rules shall apply.
- 2. All exhibitors in Open, Junior Breeding and Market shows must submit a premises identification (PID) number at entry. PID may be obtained by calling 303-869-9130 or online at <a href="https://ag.colorado.gov/animals/colorado-location-identification-lid-registration-premises">https://ag.colorado.gov/animals/colorado-location-identification-lid-registration-premises</a>.
- 3. Bedding: Exhibitors are responsible for their own livestock bedding. Entry into competition at the Colorado State Fair and Industrial Exposition ("CSF") does not include bedding.

Straw may only be used for dairy cattle, dairy goats, breeding sheep, and open breeding cattle tie-outs. All other uses of straw are prohibited.

Exhibitors may pre-order bedding and shavings through Rustic Ranch supply or bedding and shavings will be available to purchase on-grounds from Rustic Ranch Supply upon arrival. The telephone number and order portal will be posted on the Fair's website.

### Outside bedding for livestock exhibitors is permitted.

4. Original registration papers must be available for inspection at the show. All animals entered in this show must be registered with the American Shorthorn Association to be eligible to

- show. Animals must be entered and shown under the recorded ownership name.
- 5. The Rocky Mountain Shorthorn Association offers 10% of the total premiums including champion classes. The Authority will pay 90% of the total premiums including champion classes. Premium checks for the full amount will be paid directly from the Authority.
- 6. Any animal without a legible tattoo matching the registration papers will be ineligible to show.
- 7. Exhibitors in these breeding cattle classes are subject to their Association's special rules on class qualification, defects and unethical practices. All animals at all ASA sponsored shows must be officially recorded at show time to be eligible to show. An official ASA registry number at entry time will be required.
- 8. All Shorthorn entries must be duly recorded with the American Shorthorn Association. Any animal with a pending registration or without a legible tattoo will not be eligible for show competition. All entries are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the American Shorthorn Association Board of Directors and are subject to supervision of the Show and Sale Committee representing the ASA.
- 9. All animals entered in the Shorthorn show must be 15/16 Shorthorn or full blood Shorthorn with a pedigree. All animals in the Shorthorn Plus show must be 1/4 through 7/8 with a Shorthorn Plus pedigree. Cow/calf pair Champions are eligible to compete for Grand Champion Female.
- 10. ENTRY NUMBERS: Each entry will be assigned a number. Entry numbers will be provided to all exhibitors. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor when the animal is in the show ring.
- 11. Authority officials have the right to combine any class with 5 or less animals presented.
- 12. There is no limit to the number of animals an exhibitor may enter in this show or in any one of these classes. Premiums will be paid in accordance with the premium schedule listed in this division.

**PREMIER EXHIBITOR** - "Exhibitor" is defined as the owner or owners of an animal recorded on the registration paper. Each different recorded ownership (or co-ownership) constitutes a different "Exhibitor." An award will be given to the exhibitor accumulating the most points on six animals or less. In the event of tie, the winner will be the exhibitor (1) earning points in the greatest number of classes excluding champion classes, (2) winning the most first places and (3) winning the most second places, etc.
