LIMITED TO FOUR (4) GOATS PER EXHIBITOR

Competition Requirements: (subject to change without notice)

- All entrants must have read and be familiar with the Colorado State Fair General Competition Requirements, General Livestock Competition Requirements, IAFE National Show Ring Code of Ethics, Animal Welfare Policy, and Health Requirements. Exhibitors must comply with the Colorado State Fair Exhibitor Code of Conduct.
- 2. All exhibitors in Open, Junior Breeding and Market shows must submit a premises identification (PID) number at entry. PID may be obtained by calling 303-869-9130 or online at https://ag.colorado.gov/animals/colorado-location-identification-lid-registration-premises.
- 3. Bedding: Exhibitors are responsible for their own livestock bedding. Entry into competition at the Colorado State Fair and Industrial Exposition ("CSF") does not include bedding.

Straw may only be used for dairy cattle, dairy goats, breeding sheep, and open breeding cattle tie-outs. All other uses of straw are prohibited.

Exhibitors may pre-order bedding and shavings through Rustic Ranch supply or bedding and shavings will be available to purchase on-grounds from Rustic Ranch Supply upon arrival. The telephone number and order portal will be posted on the Fair's website.

Outside bedding for livestock exhibitors is permitted.

4. Wether does will show by weight. The minimum weight for wether does is **40 lbs.** and a maximum weight limit is **225 lbs.** for goats. Doe(s) that have been exhibited in the market goat show are not eligible to exhibit in the Junior Wether Doe show.

- 5. It is up to the exhibitor as to whether does are slick or fitted, they can be shown braced or natural while in the show ring. Participants may use collars or halters with a short lead when showing.
- 6. Goats must be sheared in designated areas only. There will be no shearing allowed after processing. Only hand shearers and cordless clippers may be used for touch ups after inspection.
- 7. Application of any substance per rectum or topically to change the natural position of the tail is prohibited.
- 8. Wether does may use only rubber mats, netting or shavings for bedding; no straw, kitty litter or other absorbent.
- 9. A water container with water must be visible and available for watering on a regular basis in each penned/stalled area at all times. <u>NO</u> feeding or watering of livestock in show rings, holding pens or to and from re-weigh stations will be permitted. Colorado State Fair Officials reserve the right, at its discretion to contact a CSF veterinarian to determine if water should be given. <u>Drenching for hydration purposes will be allowed for Wether Does at the CSF. No stomach pumping devises will be allowed</u>.
- 10. Due to limited space NO tack pens will be available. All items such as feed, show boxes, trimming stands, etc. are to be placed in areas designated by the Superintendents. Any of these items placed in pens may be removed without warning. DO NOT take pens apart, leave as assembled. Exhibitors may bring plywood for the top of their pens for storage.
- 11. ENTRY NUMBERS: Each entry will be assigned a number. Entry numbers will be provided to all exhibitors. These numbers must be displayed by the exhibitor when the animal is in the show ring.
- 12. There will be no official weigh-in of Wether does. Scales will be available for the exhibitors' use until the deadline for turning in the weight nomination form. An official weight nomination form must be obtained by the Exhibitor when the animal is inspected. The official weight nomination form must be turned into the Livestock Office no later than the deadline listed above. The weight(s) indicated on the weight nomination form will be the official show weight. There will be no changing of weights after the weight nomination form has been turned in.
- 13. After each class of Wether does has been placed, the top five animals will be weighed on the official scale by show officials. Wether does cannot deviate more than 5% above or below the declared show weight as previously designated by the exhibitor on the weight card. If any Wether doe is weighed out, it will be disqualified, and the remaining

animals will be moved up in placing. The disqualified goat is not eligible for any other class and will not be reweighed.

- 14. Exhibitors only are allowed in the goat holding or staging areas during show hours. No wet or iced towels will be allowed in the holding pens during the goat show.
- 15. Classes will be divided evenly into three divisions Light, Medium and Heavy.

 Champion and Reserve in each division will compete for Grand and Reserve Grand

 Champion Wether Doe.
