## Competition Requirements

1. All entrants must have read and be familiar with the General Competition Requirements, Livestock and Competition Requirements, Colorado State Fair Exhibitor Code of Conduct, Animal Welfare Policy, and Livestock Health Requirements. When applicable, all Association rules shall apply. All Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) Competition Requirements and Show Ring Code of Ethics will be enforced.

2. All entrants for livestock exhibited in Open, Breed or Market competitions must provide a premises identification number (PID) at the time of entry. To obtain a PID, contact the Colorado Department of Agriculture at 303-869-9130 or click on the following link:

3. Bedding: Exhibitors are responsible for their own livestock bedding. Entry into competition at the Colorado State Fair and Industrial Exposition ("State Fair") does not include bedding.

Exhibitors may pre-order bedding and shavings through the official bedding vendor or bedding will be available to purchase on-grounds from said vendor upon arrival. The phone number and order portal will be posted on the Fair's website.

Straw may only be used for dairy cattle, dairy goats, breeding sheep, and open breeding cattle tie-outs. All other uses of straw are prohibited.

Outside bedding for livestock exhibitors is permitted.

4. Colorado residency is not required. Exhibitors must be enrolled and active in 4-H (being 8 years of age and not have reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday as of December 31, 2025); in FFA and active in an approved VoAg school program and not have reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday as of December 31, 2025; or a Jr. Breeding Association member with proof of membership, as a current year breeding project, and have not reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday as of December 31, 2025.
5. Females may be purebred or high-grade. Regarding grade heifers, exhibitors must submit proof of ownership (Colorado Brand Certificate/Permit) upon check-in. Registered animals must be registered or leased by an association under the exhibitor's name with original papers in hand at check-in. Association leases must be filed with the county by the May deadline.
6. Original proof of ownership on all animals must be available for inspection at the show.
7. Substitutions and add-ons must be made upon arrival and check-in. No exceptions. No exceptions will be accepted at the time of show.
8. To be eligible for competition, animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. Ownership papers and legal transfer forms must be in the exhibitor's name prior to showing.

Transfers not formalized by the respective national breed association prior to show will be picked up by the superintendents and mailed to the appropriate breed association.

9. Owners/farms and families will be limited to 20 animals they may enter in individual classes. No more than two premiums will be awarded to any one owner in individual classes unless otherwise specified.
10. Animals owned in a partnership may be shown in the name of the partnership only; except that at the time of entry, a determination shall be made that such animals will be shown in the name of one (but not both) partners.
11. The exhibitor is considered the owner or member of the partnership owning the animal. Members of the same family or different families owning animals housed as one herd on the same farm will be considered one exhibitor.
12. The breeder is considered the dam's owner at the time of service.
13. Exhibitors should wear white shirts with white pants as appropriate show ring attire. No shorts will be allowed. No names or emblems will be allowed on animals or exhibitors.
14. Entry Numbers: Each entry will be assigned a number, which will be provided to all exhibitors. The exhibitor must display these numbers when the animal is in the show ring.
15. In keeping with the basic philosophy of the PDCA, ethics are the individual responsibility of the owner of each animal shown. All exhibitors must maintain a reputation of integrity and present a wholesome and progressive image of Dairy Cattle in the proper care of and management of those animals at all times. All animals must be in a sound, healthy state and presented in the show ring in a respectful manner. Violations of this code are subject to the disciplinary provisions of the appropriate dairy breed association and Authority officials.
16. Misrepresenting the age and/or milk status of any animal for the class in which it is shown, will be reported to the respective breed association and show management and will result in the animal and exhibitor being immediately disqualified.
17. 1<sup>st</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> place ribbons will be awarded in show classes.

### Competition Requirements

1. No pre-entry or entry fee is required.
2. Classes are limited to exhibitors with Junior Dairy show entries. Exhibitors must show their own animals.
3. Four age divisions are offered, with exhibitor age considered as of December 31<sup>st</sup> of the previous year.
4. The judge will consider the appearance of the animal, showmanship ability of the exhibitor, and the exhibitor's appearance, courtesy, and knowledge.

## **Junior Dairy Special Awards**

**Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders Assn.**, Leonard Johnson, 800 Pleasant Street, Beloit, WI 53511; will provide 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbons for the junior competition in each Brown Swiss class.

**Colorado Dairy Youth Extravaganza**, Larry Hooker, 525 N. 15<sup>th</sup> Street, Greeley, CO 80631; awards ten dollars (\$10.00) (paid with premiums) to every youth who exhibits at the Colorado State Fair and who also exhibits at the Colorado Dairy Youth Extravaganza.

1. The Superintendent will select a minimum of two qualifying animals from each breed during the selection of the breed Junior Champion and Senior Champion. Animals must have won first or second place in an individual class:
  - a. The female selected must be registered, identified or leased on a breed association program in the individual name of the youth owner or in a partnership with immediate family or one an approved breed association lease program in the exhibitor's name. Each junior must have an individual membership with the association.
  - b. The female selected must be bred by the individual owner or a partnership within an immediate family or have been purchased with ownership transferred to the individual's or partnership's name prior to the animal's first birthday.

2. The winner will be selected by the dairy cattle Judge. The Superintendent will select qualifying animals from each breed. If no females meet the qualifications, the awards will not be presented.
3. Cash awards will be paid directly from the Colorado Dairy Youth Foundation and presented at the Colorado State Fair.
  - a. \$ 500.00 to the first-place Senior Female
  - b. \$ 200.00 to the second-place Senior Female
  - c. \$ 300.00 to the first-place Junior Female
  - d. \$ 150.00 to the second place Junior Female
