Competition Requirements

1. All entrants must have read and be familiar with the General Competition Requirements, Livestock and Small Animal Competition Requirements, Colorado State Fair Exhibitor Code of Conduct, Animal Welfare Policy, and Livestock Health Requirements. When applicable, all association rules shall apply.
2. All entrants for livestock exhibited in Open, Breed, or Market competitions shall provide a valid premises identification number (PID) at entry. To obtain a PID, contact the Colorado Department of Agriculture at 303-869-9130 or click on the following link:

3. All exhibitors must purchase an exhibitor pass. Exhibitor wristbands (good for the entire 11-day fair) may be purchased online at the time of entry, upon arrival on the grounds at the time of check-in or daily gate passes may be purchased at the Ticket Booths located at Gates 3 and 5.

4. Bedding: Exhibitors are responsible for their own livestock bedding. Entry into competition at the Colorado State Fair and Industrial Exposition ("State Fair") does not include bedding.

Exhibitors may pre-order bedding and shavings through the official bedding vendor or bedding will be available to purchase on-grounds from said vendor upon arrival. The phone number and order portal will be posted on the Fair's website.

Straw may only be used for dairy cattle, dairy goats, breeding sheep, and open breeding cattle tie-outs. All other uses of straw are prohibited.

Outside bedding for livestock exhibitors is permitted.

5. Exhibitors may be from any state except where outlined in individual division competition requirements.
6. Exhibitors must be enrolled and active in 4-H or FFA or be an active member of a Junior Breed Association. Junior Breed Association members must be at least 8 years of age and not yet have reached their 21st birthday as of January 1 of the current year to be eligible to compete. Association members must verify membership and age.
7. Youth exhibitors must wear white during the competition.
8. The State Fair Youth Dairy Goat Show is not at liberty to change the order of the shows and classes because of the printing of judges' sheets several days ahead of the show.
9. Entries may not be added or withdrawn from classes without permission from the officials in charge after the class is in the ring and the judging has started. The class shall not be reopened after reasons have begun.
10. To be eligible to show Junior Kids born after June 1, 2026, exhibitors must have owned the dam continuously since June 1, 2026.

11. There is no limit to the number of animals an exhibitor may enter in this show or in any one of these classes. Premiums will be paid in accordance with the premium schedule listed in this division.
12. Youth Dairy Goat classes will be divided into two classification types and will be shown as indicated below.
13. Any uncertainties as to classification shall be left to the discretion of Authority officials.
14. All Youth Dairy Goats must have an individual Scrapie Premise ID tag.
15. Ribbons and premiums to 1st through 6th class place & Champion and Res. Champion Rosettes.

Classifications

Nubian Type:

All purebred, recorded grade Nubians and any grade doe with drooping ears. LaManchas show as Nubian Type.

Swiss Type:

Nigerian Dwarf, all Swiss purebreds, recorded grades, and any grade doe with erect ears.

- Does 5 years & over before Sept. 1, 2021

Junior Does:

- Junior Kid May – July, 2026
- Intermediate Kid April, 2026
- Senior Kid Feb - Mar 2026
- Junior Yearling Sept 2025 - Jan 2025
- Senior Yearling – non-milking Sept 2023 - Aug 2025

Competition Requirements

1. No pre-entry or entry fee is required.

2. Classes are limited to exhibitors with Youth Dairy Goat entries. Exhibitors must show their own animals.
3. Three age divisions are offered, with exhibitor age considered as of December of the past year.
4. The judge will consider the animal's appearance, the exhibitor's showmanship ability, and the exhibitor's appearance, courtesy, and knowledge.
5. A.D.G.A. Showmanship Rules will apply.
